

2023 SSVRC Report

Reports have already been circulated for the Crail Summer Stages, The Mach 1 Stages and the Alton Glen Meats Summer Stages at Kames.

All of the events have been very well supported by the SSVRC competitors, regularly making up a high percentage of the entry.

On the Crail Summer Stages Greig Inglis took maximum driver points, followed by Des Campbell then Ben Macdowell and Cameron Dun took top Co Driver points followed by Fiona Moir then Meghan Okane.

39 SSVRC competitors made the long journey down to Campbeltown for the Mach 1 Stages, we were using this event as a double header for points, to give them a chance if they had problems on the Saturday to fix them and get some points for the Sunday.

Alistair Inglis was first SSVRC driver on both days, followed by Ben Macdowell then Des Campbell, in the CoDrivers standings, Colin Inglis was first, Alison Horne was second and Cameron Dunn was third also on both days.

After the wide expanses of Machrihanish Airfield the penultimate round was held at Kames with a good selection of short technical stages.

The current points leaders of Des Campbell / Cameron Dunn had technical issues which dropped them down the field, this meant there were some fresh faces on the SSVRC podium. Steve Irwin was first driver, followed by Graeme Rintoul then Stephen Donnelly, in the co drivers Kirsten Irwin took top spot, followed by Thomas Purvin then Jim Rintoul.

Looking forward to the final round – the Kingdom Stages, after 6 rounds with the best 4 to count Des Campbell has a healthy lead for the drivers title, but the battle for 2nd and 3rd is still wide open, in the co drivers standings it is much closer with only a handful of points separating 1st, 2nd and 3rd.

The Championship titles will be decided at Crail and these will be presented at a combined SSVRC awards night and GMSC 50th Anniversary evening on Friday 10th November at the Laurel Bank, Markinch.
